participants and highlighted the students' potential for a bright future, while also reminding parents of their ongoing role in supporting their children's educational endeavours.

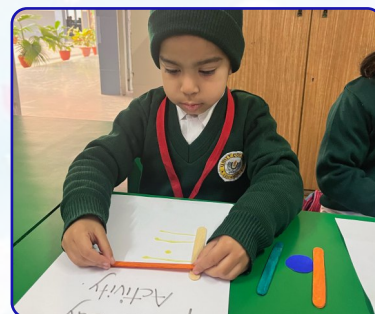
The ceremony celebrated the achievements and potential of the students as they embarked on the next phase of their academic journey.

FACULTY DEVELOPMENT SESSION BEFORE THE NEW ACADEMIC YEAR

The College geared up for the new academic year by an enriching faculty development session aimed at empowering teachers.

Teachers are the best counsellors and should provide models for excellence in work and attitude, he said.

Conveying their appreciation, both Vice Principal Mr Sachindra Bharti and Headmistress Ms Kainaat Mansoor expressed their confidence in Mr Mathews' leadership.

Complementing these strategies, Ms Kainaat Mansoor, the Headmistress, led another session for the Pre-Primary and Primary teachers. She underscored the importance of using technology to enhance learning, while maintaining a balance with traditional methods to create fruitful learning. The session also focused on fostering strong relationships with both students and parents and unpacked strategies for identifying students' skills and positive attributes, at the same time addressing classroom behaviour management.
